## TAX AND DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION TRAINING

25th -26th of March,2021.

A two-day virtual workshop was conducted by the Asian Development Bank for senior tax officers involved in or interested in digital transformation or new technologies for tax administration at the Ministry of Revenue and Customs office. (Revenue Division)

This virtual workshop was expected to provide a platform for participants to share high priority issues, visions, challenges, and lessons learned as well as participating in discussions on digital transformation in tax administration. This workshop aimed to provide a setting for developing countries to access technical support and increase their capacity to implement and accelerate their digital transformation in tax administration.

There were 25 participants per day.



## **Succession Planning Training**

As of March 22<sup>nd</sup>, HR Team successfully conducted a

succession planning training to all senior officers from each division in the Revenue Office. The purpose of this training is to make aware to Senior Management the newly formulated Succession Planning Template, in which was

developed to standardize various HR cases for times when a competent officer plans to exit from the Ministry,

whether due to retirement, resignation or internal

promotions. The idea is to limit disruptions and stabilize our daily operation, retaining the talents of employees at critical posts, to be able to delegate tasks accordingly to potential candidates at times of unscheduled absences and unforeseen circumstances.

Moreover, the introduction of this Succession Plan is driven by HR's new initiative for our Performance Management System (PMS) review desired by PSC. This includes the team having the forethought to launching a Coaching & Mentoring Training Program, aimed to invest in the competencies (talents) of our current employees, to reach full potential of capacity in the near future. Further to this initiative, we anticipate to benefit the following;

# Improving Compliance in Large Taxpayer Segment

## **Regional Workshop**

The Ministry of Revenue and Customs joined a technical webinar conducted by the Pacific Islands Tax Administrators Association (PITAA) Secretariat and the Pacific Financial Technical Assistance Center (PFTAC) of the International Monetary Fund (IMF) on Improving Compliance in the Large Taxpayers Segment on the 25<sup>th</sup> of April -3<sup>rd</sup> of March, 2021.

This webinar aimed to discuss ways to improve compliance, collect revenue and ultimately enable the governments to continue providing essential services. The webinar exploring potential areas of further improvement in the compliance of the large taxpayer sector and how the compliance model could be applied to the sector.

The workshop covered topics such as the importance of large taxpayers in reprioritizing revenue collections during COVID-19, key features of an effective large taxpayer compliance strategy and stakeholder relationship management.

Participants also discussed ways to collect data, which could be used to map strategies for revenue collection as well detection of noncompliance.

## **Operation Mercator**

Operation Mercator is a new initiated special project conducted by the Return and Dept Collection Section to initiate a special operation for action and recovering of depts that almost 5 years for the next financial year start on the  $30^{\rm th}$  of March,2021.

This project aimed to solve and minimize issues that repeatedly discussed and raised such as:

- Very high values of outstanding depts reported every year from the ministry's dept book
- High values of outstanding depts categorize as a statue barred on every write-off submission list.

In this project there are two parts for this operation which is Tax Arrears Accounts (nearly over 5years) and Completion of the Write Off Process (Cabinet Decision no.188)

The Ministry agreed to name this special operation after Gerardo Mercator, a  $16^{\rm th}$ -century geographer, cosmographer and cartographer from the country of Flanders who was most renowned for creating the 1569 world map.






